Description of the location

Sunrise Nursing Home is a privately owned home providing Nursing care services to adults aged over 65 years who require nursing or personal care.

There are instances where we will take residents who are under 65, but this will only be done if we feel the residents needs will be met at our home, typically this is for residents who are 60 and over

The home is registered for 30 residents. The home is a detached property situated in an area of larger scale Edwardian detached properties, walking distance to a mainline railway station and shopping centre of this popular Suffolk coastal town.

The accommodation provided in the home is arranged over three floors. A lift provides access to the accommodation on the first and second floors. The communal rooms are on the ground floor, comprising of spacious lounges, dining facilities and conservatory. A 'Spa' bathroom is also located on the ground floor. There are gardens for the residents to enjoy as they wish. One garden area has a fish pond for the residents to sit and relax by.

The home is managed by a suitably qualified person (A Registered Nurse – Level One Mental Health). The Manager is supported by a team of Registered Nurses and well-trained staff (Health Care Assistants, Activity Coordinator, Cooks, Front of House Kitchen staff, Domestic, Maintenance and Administration) providing person centred care to our residents. We also work closely with other professionals to ensure safe delivery of care. A Registered Nurse is on duty 24 hours a day.

The home has a fire alarm system fitted, with fire exit notices and fire emergency instructions notices displayed at key points throughout the home. All staff went through induction process including fire prevention, fire drill policy, use of the fire appliances, evacuation, muster points raising an alarm. All fire systems and alarms are tested weekly by staff. All fire fighting equipment will be checked annually by qualified fire safety engineer. Where possible, furniture, fixtures, and fittings must be made of fire resistant or fire retardant fabrics and materials. Electrical equipment is tested. Records are kept of all such testing as part of the proprietors/manager responsibility. The residents are informed of the emergency procedure during admission. The home operates a No SMOKING policy.

The home provides 24/7 care staff, good home cooking, provision for special diets, laundry services, local telephone calls, and GP and other healthcare professionals visits. The home can arrange for dry cleaning, hair dressing, chiropody, newspapers/magazines, and private care of choice at extra cost. The residents may attend religious services either within or outside the home as they so desire. Residents have the opportunity to attend monthly in-house Christian Services. The residents' family and friends are encouraged to visit the residents regularly and maintain contact via letter, email, or telephone. For security and fire safety, visitors must sign the visitor's book on each occasion.

The home's policy on "Therapeutic and Social Activities" takes into account the residents interests, skills, experiences, personalities and medical condition. Initially, information on the health and social needs are obtained during a pre-admission assessment. The home offers a wide range of activities designed to encourage the residents to keep mobile, and most importantly take an interest in life. In the unfortunate event of bereavement, the family can expect every possible support from staff. Whereas funeral arrangements are usually made by the next of kin, the Home Staff can be relied upon to assist and explain what is required. All outings are geared to resident needs and capabilities and due to this a limited number of residents can go on any outing such as visit to pantomimes or plays, Going for afternoon tea or lunch, etc.. A variety of quality monitoring and auditing tools are utilised to ensure the quality of the service we provide is fully compliant to the National Minimum Standards, such as care planning, audit, risk assessments of the environment and a maintenance audit of equipment in the Home.
